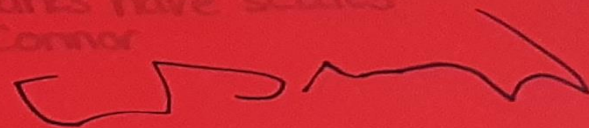




The children have been talking about what animals they know from under the Sea and during discussion time the children were asked if they would like to learn about what goes on under the Sea. Everyone said yes.

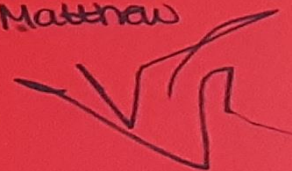

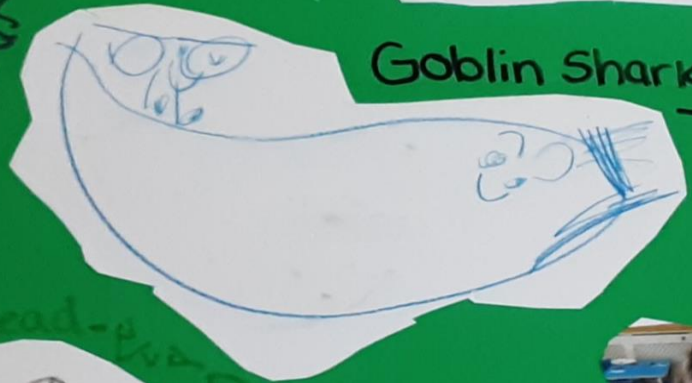

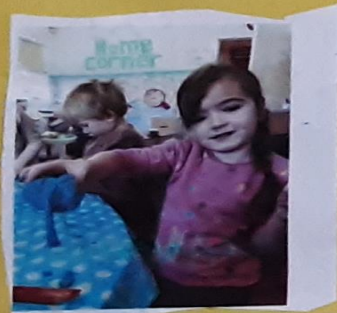
Evaluation-

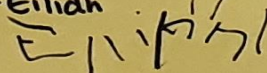

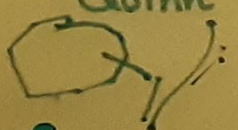

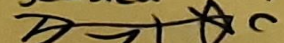

Fact sheet The Great White Shark

- Great white sharks have 300 teeth in triangle shapes.
- Sharks are older than dinosaurs.
- Great white sharks have glow in the dark eyes.
- Their blood is toxic.
- Great white sharks are warm blooded.
- Great white sharks are scared of Orcas because they hunt them.
- They eat seals, sea lions, dolphins and large fish.
- They are the largest predator fish on the planet.
- They have a very strong sense of smell.



Goblin Shark



- Goblin sharks have a long-flattened snout.
- Goblin sharks shrink as they get older.
- The Goblin shark has a nickname called Living Fossil#
- The Goblin shark can get very big.
- The Goblin shark lives at the bottom of the ocean and likes very deep water.
- The Goblin Shark can open its mouth very wide.
- The Goblin shark is a very slow swimmer and doesn't swim fast
- It eats crabs and squids.

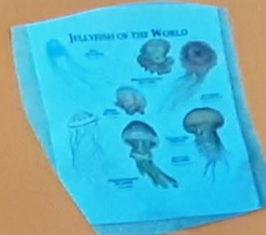
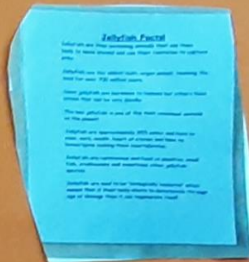
Next step - Learn about Jellyfish!

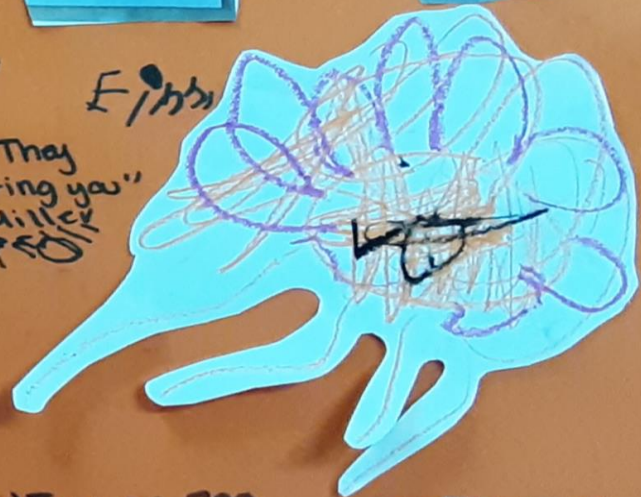

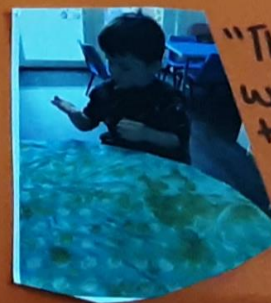
